

Photographic contest for photographers living in Iran April 2024



THE FRANCO-IRANIAN CENTRE

Ithaque is a mixed photographic space, a shared darkroom, a meeting place and an exhibition gallery. Located in the heart of Paris' Marais district, Ithaque comprises two spaces: the first transformed into a black-and-white darkroom, and the second dedicated to photographic exhibitions.

This hybrid space aims to perpetuate the techniques associated with black-and-white analog photography, in a spirit of diversity and dialogue with other modes of artistic expression. Ithaque is conceived as a place for exchange, creation and conviviality, offering unique, tailor-made experiences in a darkroom atmosphere.

With this in mind, Ithaque regularly welcomes artistphotographers who make their own prints and are looking for a quiet, creative space equipped with all the materials they need to print their work.

Ithaque opened in October 2020 and is run by Alexandre Arminjon, a finalist for the Silver Gelatin Print Prize 2021 and the youngest candidate for the Niépce Prize in 2018. Arminjon's work is part of the collection of the Bibliothèque nationale de France (BnF), and his Iranian portraits were recently the subject of a solo exhibition at the Assemblée Nationale (French Parliament).

The Franco-Iranien Centre is a French association under the law of 1901 created in 2016 and based in Paris. Its aim is to deepen and develop Franco-Iranian relations in all areas (institutional, economic and commercial, cultural and artistic, sporting, academic, etc.) and to work to strengthen the bonds of friendship between the French and Iranian peoples and the two countries.

All these areas represent the pillars of the eternal bridge linking France and Iran, and it is essential to strengthen these links through associative activity.

Between January 31st and February 3rd 2018, the Franco-Iranian Centre organised a series of meetings and conferences entitled "Femmes d'Iran, Femmes en mouvement", which led to the first visit to France by a delegation of 32 Iranian women business leaders and representatives of Iranian civil society.

The Franco-Iranian Centre organises a wide-ranging program of conferences, speeches and meetings in partnership with other organisations and partners. In 2023, this non-political association was considered to be the most active in Franco-Iranian relations, receiving extensive media coverage.

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WATER IN IRAN CONTEST

As part of the international conference organised in Paris by videoconference with Iran (September 2024-March 2025) on the theme "Regards croisés sur les cultures de l'eau, France-Iran", organised by the Académie des Sciences d'Outre-Mer (Paris), the Académie Nationale de l'Eau (Paris), the Franco-Iranian Centre (Paris), the Centre de Droit maritime et océanique (Nantes-France), the University of Tehran, and the Tarbiat-Modares University (Tehran), a major photo competition has been launched on the theme "Iran: water in all its forms", under the patronage of Mrs Francine Cousteau (President of the Cousteau Society) and Mr Jean-Louis Oliver (President of the French National Water Academy). The expected approach is that of fresh and salt water, terrestrial and oceanic environment, human activities linked to water. techniques, developments, in relation with the Iranian territory. Each candidate must send the organisers a maximum of 25 photographs, black and white or colour, in the form of a PDF document (see details below).

The aim of the contest is to combine documentary photography with experimental photography in order to highlight the water situation in Iran through a collective exhibition.

The competition is organised under the patronage of Francine Cousteau, President of the Jacques-Yves Cousteau International Foundation, and Jean-Louis Oliver, President of the French National Water Academy.





APPLICATIONS REQUIREMENTS

Candidates must be resident in Iran.

Applications must be submitted by midnight on June 14th 2024 and consist of sending a PDF document to the following adress: <info@ithaque-paris.fr> (WeTransfer will not be considered)

The subject of the e-mail and the title of the document must be: Water in Iran - First and last name.

Candidates must send their photographic proposal in the form of a PDF document of a maximum size of 10MB in English, which must include 4 elements:

- A biography of the candidate (one page);
- A letter presenting the context of the series of photographs and the author's intentions (maximum 1000 words);
- The series of photographs proposed in relation to the theme of water in Iran (no more than 25 photographs, colour and black and white photographs are accepted, analog and digital works are accepted, it is also explicitly stated that abstract, experimental, journalistic and documentary works will receive the same consideration from the jury)
- A copy of the Iranian passport or residence card in Iran.



PROGRAM

Based on the entries received, the jury will select a winner. The winner will receive a first prize of five hundred euros for the photograph selected by the jury as the best. A maximum of 40 other photographs by several other candidates will be included in a group exhibition, in which they will be presented in a maximum format of 50x60cm in a scenography designed by Alexandre Arminjon for Ithaque.

The exhibition space at Ithaque is approximately 50m², ideally located in the Marais district, in Paris.

The exhibition will initially take place at Ithaque, from Thursday September 12th to October 3rd, before moving to the headquarters of the Académies des Sciences d'Outre-mer, rue Laperouse in Paris, on October 7th 2024 and running until October 18th.

The public opening of the exhibition in Ithaque will take place on Thursday September 12th 2024.

Afshin Shahroudi


